- Abbeyfield Farm, Celbridge Road, Clane, Co. Kildare
- Ashford Self Catering, Rossana, Ashford, Co. Wicklow
- Athenaeum House Hotel, Waterford, Co. Waterford
The Athenaeum House Hotel, a lovingly restored 17th century 4 **** Georgian Manor House Hotel set on the banks of the River Suir overlooking Waterford City. - Kennedy Homestead, Dungannon, New Ross, Co. Wexford
Follow in the footsteps of one of the world's most famous Irish emigrant families, The Kennedys. This inspiring rural to riches story that culminates in the rise from famine emigrant to President is told on the site of the old Kennedy Homestead and is still famed by Kennedy family members today. A state of the art exhibition tracks the history and achievements of this iconic family.
- JFK Memorial Park & Arboretum, New Ross, Co. Wexford

Dedicated to the memory of John Fitzgerald Kennedy, 35th President of the USA, the arboretum was founded as a living tribute, by US citizens of Irish origin. The park covers 250 hectares on the southern slopes of Slieve Collige, and contains over 4,500 types of trees and shrubs. The park is also home to a children's playground, a pony & trap and the family friendly JFK Tearooms serving delicious home cooked meals, ice-creams and cakes.
- Hidden Valley Park, Rathdrum, Co. Wicklow
- Huntington Castle, Clonegal, Co. Carlow
- Jameson Visitor Centres Ireland, The Old Jameson Distillery, Bow Street, Smithfield, Dublin 7
- Kildare Maze, Prosperous, Naas, Co. Kildare
- Leisure Max, Sinnottstown Lane, Drinagh, Co. Wexford
- Malahide Castle, Malahide, Co. Dublin
- Mermaid Arts Centre, Main Street, Bray, Co. Wicklow
- Mount Congreve Estate, Kilmeadon, Co. Waterford
- Moyvalley Hotel & Golf Club, Ballyna Estate, Moyvalley, Co. Kildare
- Battle of the Boyne Visitors Centre, Oldbridge, Co. Meath
The Battle of the Boyne between King William & his father in law King James was fought on the 1st July 1690. At Stake were the British throne, France dominance in Europe & religious power in Ireland. Open all year.
- Glendalough Visitors Centre, Co. Wicklow
Famous for its monastic site founded in the 6th Century. It has a round tower, stone churches & numerous crosses. Open all year.
- Gibneys of Malahide, 6 New Street, Malahide, Co. Dublin
- Bru na Boinne Visitor Centre, Donore, Co. Meath
Interprets the archaeological heritage of the Boyne Valley, including the megalithic tombs of Newgrange & Knowth. Open all year (except Christmas)
- Maynooth Castle, Maynooth, Co. Kildare
A 13th Century castle, it boasts one of the largest keeps of its type in Ireland. Open Late May - Early October / Wed - Sun & Bank Holidays.
- Old Millfont Abbey, Tullyallen, Drogheda, Co. Louth
Ireland's first Cistercian monastery, its most unique features being its octagonal lavado c1200. Open Late June-Late Sept Daily
- Trim Castle, Trim, Co. Meath
Largest Anglo-Norman castle in Ireland, built by Hugh de Lacy in the 12th Century. Open all year (Closed Christmas Day).
Seat of the High Kings of Ireland, it was the most important centre of political & religious power in pre-Christian Ireland. Open Mid May-Mid Sept Daily.
- National Botanic Gardens, Glasnevin, Dublin 9
Open all year (closed Christmas Day). Located just 3 km from Dublin city centre, the Gardens are an oasis of calm and beauty and entry is free (Parking €2). A premier scientific institution, the gardens also contain the National Herbarium and several historic wrought iron glasshouses that have recently been restored.
- National Botanic Gardens, Kilmacurragh, Kildare, Wicklow
Tel: +353 (0)404 968944 / Open all year (Closed Christmas Day)
Kilmacurragh was once the seat of the Acton family and is now an outpost of the National Botanic Gardens. The Queen Anne style house, designed by Sir William Robinson, dates from 1697, but is now a ruin. Kilmacurragh is famous for its conifers and rhododendrons.
- St Enda's Park and The Pearse Museum, Grange Road, Rathfarnham, Dublin 16.
Tel: +353 (0)1 493 4208. Open all year except Christmas Day (Museum closed Tuesdays). St. Enda's is one of Dublin city's most charming and atmospheric parks, with riverside walks, waterfall and walled garden. It is also home to the Pearse Museum, home and school of the patriot Patrick Pearse (1879-1916). The park has a noteworthy collection of historic follies that have been restored.
- Parnell Museum & Avondale House, Avondale House & Forest Park, Rathfarnham, Co. Wicklow
Avondale House and Forest Park has much to offer the visitor whether their interest is in Charles Stewart Parnell - 'The Unconquered King of Ireland', the development of forestry in Ireland and the extensive collection of trees and shrubs from around the globe that can be seen in Avondale today. It is also a great place to visit just to enjoy the unique beauty and peace of one of Wicklow's outstanding historic estates. The forest park is some 214 hectares in extent and lies on the west bank of the Avonmore River. Its miles of roads and forest trails offer endless variety to the walker, from the long open sweep of the Great Ride to the towering conifers on the banks of the Avonmore River. - Séamus Ennis Art Centre, Naul, Finglas, Co. Dublin
The most distinctive building in the rural idyll of Naul is The Séamus Ennis Arts Centre. This traditional thatched roofed cottage houses a gallery with ongoing art exhibitions and the Centre's intimate theatre has a jam packed schedule of folk, bluesgrass, traditional Irish and contemporary gigs year round.

- St Mullins Heritage Centre, St. Mullins, Via Kilkenny, Co. Carlow
St. Mullins is a picturesque rural community in South Carlow, nestled between the Blackstairs Mountains and Brandon Hill, on the banks of the river Barrow. The award-winning Plunkin na Tire Heritage Centre is located in a former Church of Ireland church built in 1871. Between January and May 2010, the fourth year studio at the School of Architecture at UCD designed and built a new exhibition to tell the town's story and display the Centre's collection of artefacts. The Heritage Centre was officially re-opened on May 22nd, 2010.
- In addition to the exhibition, which is open to the public, the Heritage Centre also welcomes genealogy enquiries to St. Mullins or the neighbouring parishes in Wexford and Kilkenny.
- St. Patrick's Cathedral, St. Patrick's Close, Dublin 8
- The Donegal Shop, 2nd Floor, St. Stephens Green Shopping Centre, Dublin 2
- The Gaiety Theatre, 5th King St, Dublin 2

- The National Stud, Tully, Kildare Town, Co. Kildare
- The Steam Museum & Lodge Park Walled Garden, Lodge Park, Straffan, Co. Kildare
- The Transport Museum, Howth Demense, Howth, Co. Dublin
The National Transport Museum in Howth Co. Dublin is totally voluntary organisation and registered charity. The collection is Ireland's only comprehensive assembly of public and commercial road transport. A century separates the oldest (1883) and newest exhibits which are complemented by a display of small artefacts and photographs depicting the history of road transport in Ireland.
